

KS2 Unit 4, Lesson 4: The Bible

Context: In this lesson we are asking pupils to explore the Bible, how it talks about what God is like and his relationship with people and looks back at its roots in Judaism. How do Christians use the Bible? In what ways does it help them in daily life?

Overview:

- Christians believe that the Bible talks about what God is like and his relationship with people who believed in him.
- The Old Testament of the Bible is a holy book to both Jews and Christians and that Jesus was a Jew – Christianity has its roots in Judaism.

Essential core:

For Christians Bible is "God's word". For them it contains a message of Salvation, and reveals God's will for mankind - that people are created to live in loving relationship with one another and with God.
